HOW TO PROPERLY DISPOSE OF WASTE

| GENERAL INFORMATION | ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED | PICKUP DAYS |

| <p>Recycling All materials must be placed curbside no later than 7:00 AM on your collection date. Do not place items in plastic bags.</p> <p>COMMINGLED ITEMS -- RED BIN ONLY</p> <p>GLASS: Only food & beverage containers made of unbroken clear, brown or green glass. METAL: Food & beverage containers, clean aluminum foil & trays, empty aerosol cans. PLASTIC: Plastic containers (numbers 1 through 7 printed on bottom of container) commonly used for food, beverage, detergents & shampoo. No plastic bags of any kind, including newspaper sleeves.</p> <p>All commingled items should be rinsed, lids removed then placed in the RED bin. Metal lids can be placed in the bin with the commingled items. Labels need not be removed.</p> <p>PAPER ITEMS (PULP) -- BLUE BIN ONLY NEWSPAPERS, PHONE BOOKS, MAGAZINES, JUNK MAIL, BROCHURES, CATALOGUES, ADVERTISEMENTS, LETTERS & ENVELOPES & BROWN PAPER BAGS Place paper in the BLUE bin. Do not put in plastic bags. Newspapers and magazines may be placed in a brown paper bag.</p> <p>Residents may call the DPW at 271-3775 to request RED and BLUE bins which will be delivered upon request.</p> <p>CORRUGATED CARDBOARD: Collapse cardboard and place inside another box or tie in bundles. You may combine all paper/pulp items for collection. Please do not tie anything except corrugated cardboard. Do not place any paper or pulp items in plastic bags. You may put all paper items in a corrugated cardboard box or brown paper bags. Gray/compressed or smooth cardboard (i.e. tissue boxes, pizza boxes) are accepted.</p> | <p>Medical waste, syringes, IV bottles, IV tubes, etc.</p> <p>Light bulbs, kitchenware, crystal, mirrors & window glass. Paint cans, pesticide containers.</p> <p>Five gallon pails, foam plastic, oil cans, plastic bags & flower pots. Any container containing potentially hazardous chemicals or materials.</p> <p>Hardcover books, waxed cardboard containers.</p> <p>Styrofoam</p> <p>Any plastic NOT labeled 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7 inside this symbol</p>  | <p>THURSDAY North of Route 129</p> <p>FRIDAY South of Route 129</p> <p><i>See calendar on reverse side for schedule on Holiday weeks</i></p> |
| <p>Household Garbage & Bulky Items Household garbage is collected once a week on the designated day. No more than 3 (three) garbage cans, no larger than 32 gals. each and not weigh more than 70 lbs. On your regular garbage days you may throw out non-metal furniture, such as recliners, table & chairs, mattress & box spring, carpet and padding (rolled & tied, no longer than 4 ft. long and 2 ft. wide), couch (if sofa/bed the metal frame must be removed), dried paint cans lid removed. Household garbage & bulky items must be placed at the curb before 7:00 AM on the scheduled day of collection. Please check the calendar on the reverse side for the day your garbage will be collected on holiday weeks.</p> | <p>Toilets. Recyclables, household hazardous waste, metal items or white goods. Construction debris including sheet rock, lumber, concrete & stone, railroad ties and pallets.</p> | <p>MONDAY North of Route 129</p> <p>TUESDAY South of Route 129</p> <p><i>See calendar on reverse side for schedule on Holiday weeks</i></p> |
| <p>Metal, White Goods, TVs, Monitors & Electronics Residents must call the DPW at 271-3775 to schedule pick-up of metal items, washers, dryers, microwaves, refrigerators (doors must be removed), AC units, dehumidifiers, TVs, computer monitors and all electronics. Metal is picked up by appointment only. Please call by Monday morning on the week that you would like your items picked up.</p> | <p>Non-metal furniture, car batteries, car tires, construction debris and propane tanks. Propane tanks can be disposed of at a business that fills them, or the County H-MRF (see below).</p> | <p>WEDNESDAY by appointment only call 271-3775 (No Pickup Holiday weeks)</p> |
| <p>Household Hazardous Waste Westchester County operates the Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF) on the Grasslands Campus in Valhalla. The H-MRF accepts many of the same wastes collected at the Household Recycling Days, including household chemicals, electronics, Freon-containing appliances, scrap tires, BBQ tanks, fluorescent bulbs, rechargeable batteries, and confidential documents for shredding. Reserve a time slot for appointments up to two weeks in advance. Appointments can be made for Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays (excluding Federal holidays) from 10 a.m. to 2:50 p.m. by calling the Recycling HelpLine at (914) 813-5425. | <p>Yard Waste The Village of Croton-on-Hudson DPW will be collecting yard waste curbside during the spring, summer and fall months (April through October). All yard waste must be placed in biodegradable leaf bags or open top garbage cans. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected. Yard waste put out with the garbage or mixed in with the garbage will not be collected.</p> <p>Yard waste will be collected on Wednesdays:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> On the 1st & 3rd Wednesday of the month yard waste will be collected from homes North of Route 129 On the 2nd & 4th Wednesday of the month yard waste will be collected from homes South of Route 129 <p>There will be NO YARD WASTE COLLECTION on the 5th Wednesday of the following months: May 31, 2017 and August 30, 2017. The yard waste collection will begin in APRIL.</p> <p>WHAT KIND OF YARD WASTE CAN BE PUT OUT FOR COLLECTION? Raked up yard waste, small twigs, flowers, hedge trimmings may be placed in biodegradable yard waste bags. Small branches will be collected provided they meet the following criteria: 1) Cut into lengths not to exceed 4 feet; 2) Tied into bundles not exceeding 18" in diameter; 3) Not more than two bundles of small branches per collection. Grass clippings should be left on the lawn.</p> <p>HOLIDAY TREES, UNTRIMMED AND UNBAGGED, WILL BE PICKED UP WHEN PLACED CURBSIDE, DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY.</p> | <p>Tree trunks, stumps, large limbs over 4" in diameter, dirt, sod, stones, concrete, bricks, and railroad ties.</p> <p>NO BAGGED LEAVES</p> <p>Lumber Shrubs & Bushes</p> | <p>1st & 3rd WEDNESDAY of the month from North of Route 129</p> <p>2nd & 4th WEDNESDAY of the month from South of Route 129</p> <p>Yard Waste beginning in APRIL</p> |
| <p>Fall Leaves The Village does not pick up bagged leaves. The Village strongly recommends that residents mulch/mow leaves on their property. Mulch/mowing leaves has many benefits. For additional information visit the Village website at www.crotononhudson-ny.gov and click on the "Love'em and Leave'em" link on the Public Works page.</p> <p>Loose leaves that cannot be mulch/mowed should be placed adjacent to the street or curb, but should not be placed in the street or on the sidewalk. No twigs, branches, or other yard waste should be mixed in with the loose leaves.</p> <p>Collection of loose leaves usually begins in early November. Every Thursday the Village will post the list of streets where loose leaves will be vacuumed in the subsequent week on the Village website, at www.crotononhudson-ny.gov. Residents can also sign up for email notifications by going to www.crotononhudson-ny.gov and clicking on "Subscribe to News."</p> | <p>Piles contaminated with twigs, branches, or other yard waste.</p> <p>NO BAGGED LEAVES</p> | <p>Fall Leaves Beginning early November. Schedule will be listed on Village website each Thursday in November and December: www.crotononhudson-ny.gov</p> |
