# HOW TO PROPERLY DISPOSE OF WASTE

GENERAL INFORMATION	ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED	PICKUP DAYS
<p><b>Recycling</b> All materials must be placed curbside by 7:00 AM on the collection date. <b>Do not place items in plastic bags.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>COMMINGLED ITEMS</b></p> <p><b>GLASS:</b> Only food &amp; beverage containers made of unbroken clear, brown or green glass. <b>METAL:</b> Food &amp; beverage containers, clean aluminum foil &amp; trays, empty aerosol cans. <b>PLASTIC:</b> ONLY PET &amp; HDPE plastic containers (number 1 or 2 printed on bottom of container) commonly used for food, beverage, detergents &amp; shampoo. <b>No plastic bags of any kind.</b></p> <p><b>All commingled items should be rinsed, lids removed then placed in the RED bin.</b> Metal lids can be placed in the bin with the commingled items. Plastic lids should be placed in the garbage. Labels need not be removed.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>PAPER ITEMS (PULP)</b></p> <p>NEWSPAPERS, PHONE BOOKS, MAGAZINES, JUNK MAIL, BROCHURES, CATALOGUES, ADVERTISEMENTS, LETTERS &amp; ENVELOPES &amp; BROWN PAPER BAGS Place in the <b>BLUE</b> bin. Do not put in plastic bags. Newspapers and magazines may be placed in a brown paper bag.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>CORRUGATED CARDBOARD</b></p> <p>Collapse cardboard and place inside another box or tie in bundles.</p> <p>You may combine all paper/pulp items for collection. Please do not tie anything except corrugated cardboard. As of December 10, 2008 gray/compressed or smooth cardboard (i.e., tissue boxes, pizza boxes) will be picked up.</p> <p>Do not place any paper or pulp items in plastic bags. You may put all paper items in a corrugated cardboard box or brown paper bags.</p>	<p>Medical waste, syringes, IV bottles, IV tubes, etc.</p> <p>Light bulbs, kitchenware, crystal, mirrors &amp; window glass. Paint cans, pesticide containers.</p> <p>Five gallon pails, foam plastic, oil cans, plastic bags &amp; flower pots.</p> <p>Any container containing potentially hazardous chemicals or materials.</p> <p>Hardcover books, waxed cardboard containers (milk &amp; orange juice).</p> <p>Any plastic <b>NOT</b> labeled 1 or 2 inside this symbol</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>THURSDAY</b> North of Route 129</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>FRIDAY</b> South of Route 129</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>See calendar on reverse side for schedule on Holiday weeks</i></p>
<p><b>Household Garbage &amp; Bulky Items</b> Household garbage is collected once a week on the designated day. Garbage cans should not be larger than 32 gals. each and not weighing more than 70 lbs. On your regular garbage days you may throw out non-metal furniture, such as recliners, table &amp; chairs, mattress &amp; box spring, carpet (rolled &amp; tied, no longer than 4 ft. long and 2 ft. wide), couch (if sofa/bed the metal frame must be removed), dried paint cans lid removed. Household garbage &amp; bulky items must be placed at the curb before 7:00 AM on the scheduled day of collection. Please check the calendar on the reverse side for the day your garbage will be collected on Holiday weeks.</p>	<p>Recyclables, household hazardous waste, metal items or white goods. Construction debris including sheet rock, lumber, concrete &amp; stone.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>MONDAY</b> North of Route 129</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>TUESDAY</b> South of Route 129</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>See calendar on reverse side for schedule on Holiday weeks</i></p>
<p><b>Metal, White Goods, TVs, Monitors &amp; Electronics</b> Residents must call the DPW at 271-3775 to schedule pick-up of metal items, washers, dryers, microwaves, refrigerators (doors must be removed), AC units, dehumidifiers, TVs, computer monitors and all electronics. Metal is picked up by appointment only. Please call by Monday morning on the week that you would like your items picked up.</p>	<p>Non-metal furniture, car batteries, car tires, construction debris and propane tanks. Propane tanks should be disposed of at a business that fills them such as Paraco or Burnwell in Peekskill.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>WEDNESDAY by appointment only</b> call 271-3775 (No Pickup Holiday weeks)</p>
<p><b>Household Hazardous Waste</b> Drop off household waste that can't be set out for curbside collection or recycling. Year-round options for disposal of many of these items are also available. Those items are identified below with an *. To find out about everyday disposal of these items, call 2-1-1. <b>Accepted properly labeled household chemicals include:</b> antifreeze, brake fluid, gasoline; kerosene, butane, charcoal fluid, turpentine; metal, jewelry &amp; furniture polishes, wood preservatives; pesticides, insecticides, herbicides; photographic &amp; swimming pool chemicals; fluorescent light bulbs* &amp; CFLs; fire extinguishers; propane tanks (2, 5, 10 &amp; 20 lb); batteries* - auto, non-rechargeable, rechargeable &amp; button cell; cell phones*; car tires* (maximum 10); mercury thermometers* and thermostats; expired or unused pharmaceuticals - both prescription &amp; over the counter; plastic grocery bags* - bring in 20 bags or more and get a free reusable shopping bag - while supplies last. <b>Household Recycling Days:</b> March 19 &amp; 20, Georges Island Park, Montrose; April 9 &amp; 10, Playland Park, Rye; May 7 &amp; 8, Franklin D. Roosevelt State Park, Yorktown Heights; June 11 &amp; 12, Westchester Community College, Valhalla; September 25, County Recycling Center, Yonkers; October 15 &amp; 16, Franklin D. Roosevelt State Park, Yorktown Heights; November 5 &amp; 6, Playland Park, Rye; November 19 &amp; 20, Glen Island Park, New Rochelle.</p>	<p>Paint (once paint is dried out, place can with garbage — tops must be removed), products for commercial or industrial users.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Contact the HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL CLEANUP HOTLINE 2-1-1</b></p>
<p><b>Yard Waste</b> <b>This year the Village of Croton-on-Hudson DPW will be collecting yard waste curbside during the spring, summer and fall months (April through October).</b> All yard waste must be placed in <b>biodegradable leaf bags or open top garbage cans. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected.</b> Yard waste put out with the garbage or mixed in with the garbage will not be collected. <b>Yard waste will be collected on Wednesdays:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>On the <b>1st &amp; 3rd Wednesday of the month</b> yard waste will be collected from homes <b>North of Route 129</b></li> <li>On the <b>2nd &amp; 4th Wednesday of the month</b> yard waste will be collected from homes <b>South of Route 129</b></li> </ul> <p>There will be <b>NO YARD WASTE COLLECTION on the 5th Wednesday of the following months:</b> (March 31, '10; June 30, '10; Sept. 29, '10;) The yard waste collection will begin in <b>April and continue through the end of October.</b> <b>WHAT KIND OF YARD WASTE CAN BE PUT OUT FOR COLLECTION?</b> Leaves, raked up yard waste, small twigs, flowers, hedge trimmings may be placed in biodegradable yard waste (leaf) bags. Small branches will be collected provided they meet the following criteria: 1) Cut into lengths not to exceed 4 feet. 2) Tied into bundles not exceeding 18" in diameter. 3) Not more than two bundles of small branches per collection. <b>Grass clippings</b> should be left on the lawn.</p>	<p>Tree trunks, stumps, large limbs over 4" in diameter, dirt, sod, stones, concrete and bricks.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>1st &amp; 3rd WEDNESDAY of the month from North of Route 129</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>2nd &amp; 4th WEDNESDAY of the month from South of Route 129</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Yard Waste April through October</b></p>
<p><b>Fall Leaves</b> Leaves may be placed in biodegradable leaf bags or loose behind the curb.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>On the <b>1st &amp; 3rd Wednesday</b> of the month leaves will be collected in paper bags from homes <b>North of Route 129.</b></li> <li>On the <b>2nd &amp; 4th Wednesday</b> of the month leaves will be collected in paper bags from homes <b>South of Route 129.</b></li> </ul> <p>Loose leaves should NOT be placed <b>in the street</b> or on the sidewalk. <b>No twigs, branches or other yard waste should be mixed in with the loose leaves.</b> The list of streets where loose leaves will be vacuumed will be placed on the Village web page <a href="http://crotononhudson-ny.gov">http://crotononhudson-ny.gov</a> beginning in early November. The list of streets the leaf trucks will be on the following week can be found on the web page each Friday in November and December.
