Village clarifies park use policies

[Croton-on-Hudson, NY October 27, 2009] With Indian Summer warming the air into late October, the Village wishes to clarify park use policies for its residents. “All our Village parks remain open to village and school district residents,” noted Abe Zambrano, Village Manager. “However, swimming is prohibited at all our parks, unless a life guard is on duty. The life guard season and therefore the swimming ended Labor Day weekend.”

The Village operates 13 public parks from small neighborhood playgrounds to the largest and newest, Croton Landing. Croton Landing is located on the Hudson River at the terminus of Elliott Way, north of the Croton Yacht Club. The Croton Landing Park is unique in that its half mile of walking and cycling paths are also open to anyone from outside the village or school district as part of the Westchester County RiverWalk. The completed Croton Landing comprises 10 riverfront acres that have become a Hudson River destination for bikers, walkers, joggers, dog walkers (on a leash), wind-surfers, kayakers, picnickers, fisherman, and boaters from all around Westchester.
