After a multi-year closure, the Village Engineering Department has successfully overseen the reconstruction and repaving of the Half Moon Bay Promenade and it is now reopened for Village residents to use and enjoy. The promenade is open for use from 5:30 AM to 9 PM May 1st through October 31st, and 6 AM to 6 PM at all other times. Please note that bicycling, skateboarding, fishing, and swimming is prohibited on the promenade.

All residents are encouraged to walk along the promenade this summer and experience the beautiful view!

## Croton-on-Hudson Adopts NYStretch Energy Code

In 2022, the Croton-on-Hudson Village Board began the process of adopting the NYStretch Energy Code, also known as NYStretch.

NYStretch is a model, locally adoptable stretch code that is up to 12% more efficient than the minimum requirements of the base energy code, leading to reduced energy costs for residents and businesses.

The Code was approved on June 21st, 2022 by the Board of Trustees. NYStretch will apply to new construction in the Village. An FAQ on the new code can be found on the Village website. #### Con Edison to Begin Gas Main Installation Project on Grand Street

Con Edison has advised the Village that their contractor will be beginning a gas main installation project on Grand Street from Old Post Road South (the dummy light) to Harrison Street this summer. The work will take place Mondays through Saturdays from 8 AM until 7 PM and is expected to take six months for completion. Updates on the project are available on the Village website.

#### Update on Community Choice Aggregation (CCA)

If you are a participant in Sustainable Westchester's Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) program, called Westchester Power, you may have received a notice in the mail that the 100% Renewable or Standard electricity supply offering through Westchester Power's Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) is on a temporary pause. This change has occurred through no control of the Village.

On June 30th, 2022, Westchester Power reached the end of its current contract term for participants in the Con Edison service territory. Due to volatile energy market prices, the program has been put on a temporary pause. Effective Friday, July 1st, participants who receive either the 100% Renewable or Standard electricity supply offering through Westchester Power in the Con Edison utility territory will begin reverting to the default Con Edison electricity supply. There will be no interruption in your electricity service. You can find more information about these changes by visiting <u>sustainablewestchester.org</u>.

#### **Noise Ordinance Reminders**

With the warmer months comes open windows and more outdoor activities. Residents are encouraged to be mindful of the Village's noise code.

The operation of power lawn mowers, rakers, electric leaf blowers and other motor-driven law/garden equipment is prohibited between 8 PM and 8 AM from Sunday through Friday and from 8 PM Friday to 9 AM Saturday, and from 8 PM Saturday to 10 AM Sunday. **Use of gas-powered leaf blowers is banned in the Village between June 1st & August 31st.**  Please also be mindful of your sound system volume. Decibel levels are limited for speakers and amplifiers from 10 PM to 8 AM on weekdays and from 11 PM Saturday to 10 AM Sunday.
