Village Board Appoints New Manager & Treasurer

On May 17, 2021, the Village Board appointed Bryan Healy to serve as the next Village Manager effective August 9. Mr. Healy, who now serves as the Secretary to the Village Manager, will be succeeding current Village Manager Janine King, who is retiring on August 6.

Mr. Healy, who has worked for the Village for the last three years, has a B.A. in Political Science from Fordham University and a Master's in Public Administration from Marist College.

The Village Manager serves as the chief executive officer of the Village and works with the Village Board of Trustees to implement policy and run the day-to-day operations of the Village.

On May 24, 2021, the Village Board appointed Daniel Tucker to serve as the next Village Treasurer effective August 2. Mr. Tucker will be succeeding current Village Treasurer Sandra Bullock, who is also retiring on July 31.

Mr. Tucker has worked for the last four years as the Village Treasurer in Ellenville, New York. He has a B.A. in Actuarial Science from the State University of New York at Binghamton.

The Village Treasurer serves as the chief financial officer of the Village and assists with the formulation and management of the annual budget, as well as the issuance of bonds and other debt.

Municipal Building Reopens by Appointment

Village offices at the Stanley H. Kellerhouse Municipal Building have reopened to the public by appointment only as of May 24, 2021. Dog Park Hours Updated

At the Village Board meeting on May 17, the decision was made to amend the hours of operation for the Black Rock Dog Park. Effective immediately, the hours for the dog park will be as follows:

- 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.
- 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday from April I – September 30.
- 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday from October 1 – March 31.

To register for the dog park, you must have a valid dog license for your dog and a valid Parks ID Card for yourself. Visit the Village website to obtain the necessary forms.

Residential Sign Law Amended

At the Village Board meeting on May 17, the board held a public hearing to discuss Local Law Introductory 3 of 2021 to amend the Village's Zoning Code with respect to signage on residential property. After hearing from residents, the board voted to amend the law.

Residents who live in residential zoning districts are now permitted to have up to three non-illuminated residential yard signs not exceeding six square feet each, and no higher than 42 inches above the existing ground surface shall be permitted.

Reminder: License Your Dog

Did you know? New York State law requires all dogs over the age of four months to be licensed. Here are some reasons to license your dog (besides, of course, it being the law):

- Licensing prevents the spread of rabies: all licensed dogs must show proof of inoculation against rabies.
- Easy pet identification: simply provide the license tag number to the Police Dept. or Village Clerk's Office and the owner's information is readily available.
- Help care for/prevent lost animals: A portion of the license fee goes to support local animal control programs.

Do Not Flush Wipes Down the Drain

The Village has recently been experiencing backups and drainage issues in our sewer system due to flushable wipes.

Flushable wipes can cause problems in the sewer mains, where they join commonly flushed items from other homes. Although wet wipes are described as "flushable" and "septic safe" on the packaging, this isn't actually the case. They are constructed differently and do not break down in water and the sewer system as toilet paper does.
