## **New 25 MPH Speed Limits Implemented**

After discussions held by the Board of Trustees, and the Bicycle-Pedestrian Committee, the Village Manager has recently amended the Vehicle and Traffic Code of the Village of Crotonon-Hudson to introduce new 25 MPH speed limits to certain roads in Croton-on-Hudson. These roadways are as follows:

Cleveland Drive from Gerstein St. to Benedict Blvd.

Grand Street from Route 129 to S. Riverside Ave.

Old Post Road N. from Grand St. to Brook St.

Old Post Road S. from Grand St. to Cleveland Dr.

These new speed limits went into effect on August 27. Drivers are asked to observe the new speed limits on these roadways. The Croton Police Department will be enforcing these speed limits as part of their regular enforcement details.

## **Smoking/Vaping Banned in Village Parks**



The Village Board, at their regular meeting on August 20, held a public hearing to consider banning smoking and vaping in all village parks. After the close of the public hearing, the Board voted unanimously to adopt a local law to prohibit smoking and vaping in all village parks, including Senasqua, Croton Landing, Silver Lake, Vassallo, Gouveia, Dobbs, Firefighters, Duck Pond and Manes. Village playgrounds are also included in this ban.

Signage will be updated at all village parks and fields to reflect the new regulations. All residents and their guests are asked to observe the new regulation.

#### Village Planning Multi-Cultural Festival

The Village Board, under the direction of Trustee Amy Attias, has scheduled a multi-cultural festival for September 29 at Senasqua Park. The festival will run from noon to 4 p.m. This festival will highlight the many different cultures observed in Croton-on-Hudson! There will be musical and dance performances, as well as different food trucks representing various different culinary tastes. #### **Village Hires New Police Officer**



On July 23, the Village Board of Trustees appointed Jeremy Davis as the village's newest police officer. Officer Davis comes to the Village of Croton-on-Hudson from the SUNY-Purchase Police Department, where he served as an officer for seven years.

Davis, born and raised in the village, graduated from Croton-Harmon High School in 2004. He has spent the past month learning the policies and procedures of the Croton Police Department, and has completed his field training. Please be sure to stop and introduce yourself if you see Officer Davis around town!

#### **New Lighting at Municipal Building**

The Village's Sustainability Committee, led by Lindsay Audin, recently secured a \$50,000 grant from NYSER-DA to convert the lighting at the Municipal Building to LED technology. The grant covered 100% of the costs involved with this conversion. Due to this change, the annual electric consumption will be reduced by 76,000 kWh, which will result in approximately \$12,000 in savings each year. Additionally, the peak electric demand will be cut by 16.4 kW and the annual greenhouse gas emissions will be reduced by about 16.3 short tons. As part of the grant, a dozen lighting control technologies have been displayed in the 2nd Floor hallway to allow officials from other towns to tour the demonstrations. The Village appreciates the efforts by the volunteer members of the Sustainability Committee to help reduce our footprint and save taxpayer money!

#### **BCC 9/11 Memorial Ceremony**

A Memorial ceremony will be held on Tuesday, September II at 4 pm at Croton Landing sponsored by the Town of Cortlandt, and Villages of Buchanan and Croton-on-Hudson. To attend the ceremony, please gather at the Croton Landing parking area at the north end of Elliott Way at 3:30 pm for the ceremony at 4 pm. Led by a color guard from the community, participants will walk in procession along the quarter mile pathway north to the memorial site on the Hudson River. A van from the Village of Croton will be in the parking area to transport those who need assistance.

#### **Tree Sub-Committee Formed**

The Croton Conservation Advisory Committee has formed a Tree Sub-Committee, to assist the village with preserving and improving our urban forest. Led by local arborist Guy Pardee, the group will begin by recommending tree species for the street tree program, suggesting planting sites, exploring the possibility of a "Plant-a-Tree" program, and developing education and outreach materials.

Trees planted throughout an urban area reduce both surface and air temperatures. Researchers have found that planting one tree to the west and one to the south of a home can significantly reduce energy consumption (8-18% decrease in annual cooling costs, 2-8% decrease in annual heating costs). Leaves filter particles from the air, including dust, ozone, carbon monoxide and other air pollutants. A medium- large tree can absorb (sequester) approximately 48 pounds of carbon per year.

### **Important Information for Dog Owners**

Dogs are not allowed to roam off-leash anywhere in the Village except at the Dog Park at Black Rock for which a permit is required. Leashed dogs may only be brought to the other areas at Black Rock Park and the Riverwalk Trail at Croton Landing Park during park hours. All other parks, fields, and school properties are off-limits to dogs, leashed or unleashed. Leashed dogs may be curbed in the part of the street lying between the two curb lines. All feces must be removed by the walker and deposited in an airtight container and placed in a refuse container - never in storm drains or sewers.

In New York State all dogs, 4 months and older, must be licensed. Licenses for Village residents' dogs can be obtained in the Village Office for a fee upon presenting a current rabies certificate. The fee is \$15 or \$25 depending upon whether the dog is spayed or neutered. Part of the unneutered/unsprayed fee is used by the State to fund such programs across the state.
