Village DPW Upgrades Parks

The Department of Public Works has completed numerous projects to upgrade and add new features to our Village parks, including brand-new bocce courts

The Department of Public Works has been busy this summer completing numerous improvement projects across the Village.

The Building Maintenance Division recently finished the exterior renovations to the Senasqua Park Bathhouse, which included a new roof, siding, stucco finish, and a new area to view movies at the park. A new roof was also installed at the Silver Lake Pavilion. Two decorative planting areas were reconstructed—one at Senasqua Park, and one at the Croton Landing flagpole.

Two bocce courts were constructed at Black Rock Park and are officially open for resident use. The Highway Division completed major improvements to Jacoby Street, which included new drainage, swales, curbing, and blacktop.

Fall Hydrant Flushing Program

The Village of Croton-on-Hudson Water Department will begin the semi-annual hydrant-flushing program on September 12, 2022. Flushing will be performed Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 9:30 p.m. The flushing program is expected to take four weeks to complete.

Updates on which streets will have their hydrants flushed will be posted when possible on the Village's website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts.

As the hydrant-flushing program nears your neighborhood, you may notice a slight discoloration of your water. This is temporary and

poses no health risk. Simply run your water for a short period of time until it clears up. Do not do any laundry until you are sure your water is clear. If the discoloration persists, contact the Croton-on-
