With much fanfare, the ribbon-cutting for the Elliott Way improvements was held on Monday, June 11. In attendance at the ceremony, and providing comments, were Mayor Brian Pugh, along with former mayors Greg Schmidt and Robert Elliott, and Assemblywoman Sandy Galef. The culmination of a multi-year project, the improvements to Elliott Way include a newly paved two-way road which is shared between motorists and cyclists. An elevated walkway was also installed to create one continuous walkway between Senasqua Park and Croton Landing. All residents are encouraged to walk along the river this summer and enjoy the new amenities!



Housing Charette Held on June 13

The Village of Croton-on-Hudson, in partnership with the Pace Land Use Law Center, recently hosted a housing charette at the Harmon Firehouse, 30 Wayne Street. The purpose of the charette was to ask participants, "What are Croton's Future Housing Needs?" Village officials decided on this format to receive comments as public involvement is critical to the Village's future planning efforts, as well as long-term implementation of policies and regulations. For about 90 minutes, 40 residents and officials discussed the housing stock currently in Croton, what housing stock is currently missing, what they love about the village in general and what changes are needed to advance housing opportunities.

Website Upgrade in the Works

At the June 18th Board of Trustees meeting, the Village Manager was authorized to sign an agreement with Virtual Towns and Schools to upgrade the current village website to use Drupal, a web-based content management software. This upgrade will allow the village staff to more easily update information on the website, especially in emergency or time-sensitive situations. Security features will also be upgraded and the website will have translation ability into 50 different languages. Staff will be working on this project over the summer and the new website is expected to roll out sometime in the fall. Stay tuned!

Security Camera Registry

The Croton-on-Hudson Police Department recently launched an effort to have residents and businesses voluntarily register their surveillance systems in an effort to help combat crime in the village. Many residents and businesses are now utilizing surveillance cameras and these cameras may capture persons and events without the owner's knowledge and this captured information may help the police department solve crimes and help keep the village safe. Croton Considers Single-Use Bag Ban

The village administration and Board of Trustees have been discussing the possibility of a ban on single-use plastic bags. At a work session on June 11, the Board met with representatives from the Croton Climate Initiative and the New Castle Sustainability Advisory Board. With approximately 40 residents in the audience, these representatives discussed the planning process and implementation of the plastic bag ban in the Town of New Castle as of January 1, 2017. The Board has expressed interest in investigating the feasibility of a ban in the village. The Board of Trustees will be discussing this issue at their July 16 work session. Residents are welcome to attend, but comments are not accepted by the public at work sessions. Residents may submit their comments to the Board by emailing managersoffice@crotononhudson-ny.gov.

New DPW Facility Work Continues

Work continues on the new DPW facility on Route 129. The Board of Trustees recently awarded a contract to Mancon Inc. for skilled work that cannot be undertaken by public works employees. Being cognizant of costs, the village has its employees doing many tasks in the building, including laying down flooring and painting. The move-in date for the new facility is tentatively scheduled for September.
