HOW TO PROPERLY DISPOSE OF WASTE		
GENERAL INFORMATION	ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED	PICKUP DAYS
Recycling All materials must be placed curbside no later than 7:00 AM on your collection date.	Medical waste, syringes, IV bottles, IV tubes, etc.	
COMMINGLED ITEMS RED BIN ONLY	Light bulbs, kitchenware, crystal, mirrors & window glass. Paint cans, pesticide containers.	
METAL: Food & beverage containers, clean aluminum foil & trays, empty aerosol cans.  PLASTIC: Plastic containers (numbers 1 through 7 printed on bottom of container) commonly used for food, beverage, detergents & shampoo. Gabel top refrigerated food and beverage cartons	Five gallon pails, foam plastic, oil cans, plastic bags & flowerpots. Any container containing potentially hazardous chemicals or materials. PAPER ITEMS (PULP) BLUE BIN ONLY	Hardcover books, waxed cardboard containers.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD: Collapse cardboard and place inside another box or tie in bundles. You may combine all paper/pulp items for collection. Please do not tie anything except corrugated cardboard. Do not place any paper or pulp items in plastic bags. You may put all paper items in a corrugated cardboard box or brown paper bags. Gray/compressed or smooth cardboard (i.e. tissue boxes, pizza boxes) are accepted.	inside this symbol

Westchester County operates the Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF) on the Valhalla. The H-MRF accepts many of the same wastes collected at the Household Rechousehold chemicals, electronics, Freon-containing appliances, scrap tires, BBQ tanks rechargeable batteries, and confidential documents for shredding.
