HOW TO PROPERLY DISPOSE OF WASTE		
GENERAL INFORMATION	ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED	PICKUP DAYS
Recycling All materials must be placed curbside no later than 7:00 AM on your collection date.	Medical waste, syringes, IV bottles, IV tubes, etc.	
Do not place items in plastic bags. <u>COMMINGLED ITEMS RED BIN ONLY</u> <u>GLASS</u> : Only food & beverage containers made of unbroken clear, brown or green glass.	Light bulbs, kitchenware, crystal, mirrors & window glass. Paint cans, pesticide containers.	
METAL: Food & beverage containers, clean aluminum foil & trays, empty aerosol cans. PLASTIC: Plastic containers (numbers 1 through 7 printed on bottom of container) commonly used for food, beverage, detergents & shampoo. Gable top refrigerated food and beverage cartons. No plastic bags of any kind, including newspaper sleeves.	Five-gallon pails, foam plastic, oil cans, plastic bags & flowerpots. Any container containing potentially hazardous chemicals or materials.	THURSDAY North of Route 129 FRIDAY
All commingled items should be rinsed, lids removed, then placed in the <u>RED</u> bin. Metal lids can be placed in the bin with the commingled items. Labels need not be removed. PAPER ITEMS (PULP) BLUE BIN ONLY	Hardcover books, waxed cardboard containers.	South of Route 129
NEWSPAPERS, PHONE BOOKS, MAGAZINES, JUNK MAIL, BROCHURES, CATALOGUES, ADVERTISEMENTS, LETTERS & ENVELOPES, & BROWN PAPER BAGS Place paper in the <u>BLUE</u> bin. Do not put in plastic bags. CORRUGATED CARDBOARD: Collapse cardboard and place inside another box, or tie in bundles. You may combine all paper/pulp items for collection. Please do not tie anything except corrugated cardboard. Do not place any paper or pulp items in plastic bags. You may put all paper items in a corrugated cardboard box or brown paper bags. Household Garbage & Bulky Items Household garbage is collected once a week on the designated day. No more than three (3) garbage cans, no larger than 32 gals. each and not weighing more than 70 lbs.	Toilets. Recyclables, household hazardous waste, metal items	MONDAY North of Route 129 TUESDAY
On your regular garbage days, you may throw out <u>non-metal furniture</u> , such as recliners, tables & chairs, mattresses & box springs, carpet and padding (rolled & tied, no longer than 4 ft. long and 2 ft. wide), couches (if sofa bed, the metal frame must be removed), and dried	or white goods. Construction debris including sheet rock, lumber, concrete & stone, railroad ties and pallets.	South of Route 129 See calendar on
paint cans (lids removed). Household garbage & bulky items must be placed at the curb 7:00 AM on the scheduled day of collection. Metal, White Goods, TVs, Monitors & Electronics Residents must call the DPW at 271-3775 or submit a metal pick-up request form on our website: www.crotononhudson-ny.gov to schedule the pick-up of metal items, washers, dryers, microwaves, refrigerators (doors must be removed), AC units, dehumidifiers, TVs, computer monitors and all electronics, as well as metal hangers. Metal is picked up by appointment only. Please call by Monday morning on the week that you would like your items picked up.	Non-metal furniture, car batteries, car tires, construction debris and propane tanks. Propane tanks can be disposed of at a business that fills them, or the County H-MRF (see below). Household Hazardous Waste Westchester County operates the Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF) on the Grasslands Campus in Valhalla. The H-MRF accepts many of the same wastes collected at the Household Recycling Days, including household chemicals, electronics, Freon-containing appliances, scrap tires, BBQ tanks, fluorescent bulbs, rechargeable batteries, and confidential documents for shredding. Reserve a time slot for appointments up to two weeks in advance. Appointments can be made for Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays (excluding Federal holidays) from 10 a.m. to 2:50 p.m. by calling the Recycling Helpline at (914) 813-5425. Yard Waste The Village of Croton-on-Hudson DPW will be collecting yard waste curbside		
during the spring, summer and fall months (April through October). All yard waste must be placed in biodegradable leaf bags or open-top garbage cans. <u>Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected</u> . Yard waste put out with the garbage or mixed in with the garbage will not be collected. No more than ten bags or three open-top garbage cans per pickup.  following months: June 30 and September 29. The yard waste collection will begin in <u>APRIL</u>. WHAT KIND OF YARD WASTE CAN BE PUT OUT FOR COLLECTION? Raked-up yard waste, small twigs, flowers, and hedge trimmings may be placed in biodegradable yard waste bags. Small branches will be collected, provided they meet the following criteria: 1) Cut into lengths not to exceed 4 feet; 2) Tied into bundles not 	Lumber Shrubs & bushes Unbundled branches	Yard Waste beginning in APRIL
 Cut into lengths not to exceed 4 feet, 2) fied into bundles not exceeding 18" in diameter; 3) Not more than two bundles of small branches per collection. Grass clippings should be left on the lawn. HOLIDAY TREES, UNTRIMMED AND UNBAGGED, WILL BE PICKED UP WHEN PLACED CURBSIDE, DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY. 		
Fall Leaves Fall Leaves The Village strongly recommends that residents mulch/mow leaves on their property. Mulch/mowing leaves has many benefits. For additional information, visit the Village website at www.crotononhudson-ny.gov. Leaf Vacuuming Loose leaves that cannot be mulch/mowed should be placed adjacent to the street or curb, but should not be placed in the street or on the sidewalk. No twigs, branches, or other yard waste should be mixed in with the loose leaves. Collection of loose leaves begins November 1.
