Storm Fells Croton's Iconic Merwin Oak

On the morning of June 1st, the Village of Croton-on-Hudson was notified that the Merwin Oak in Vassallo Park had fallen following an intense weekend storm. No one was injured and damage was limited to a nearby park fence and garbage can.

The majestic Swamp White Oak, which was at least 235 years old, was officially recognized by the National Arborist Association and International Society of Arboriculture in 1987. The Village worked to preserve the iconic tree across the decades. The tree was professionally treated for wood rot fungus in 2012. Numerous branches were removed and cables were installed to keep it stable. Unfortunately, time and storms eventually took their toll.

Croton residents took to social media to share fond memories of the iconic tree, which was a historic and beloved fixture in the Village.

"Grateful thanks to the Merwin Oak that shaded and fortified our village," a resident wrote on Facebook. "Older than our republic, may it be long remembered."

The Village is currently working to stabilize a portion of the tree's trunk and preserve some of the wood for potential future uses.





Keep Croton's Boating Water Clean!

Boating is a great way to spend a warm and sunny day. Enjoying a day on the Hudson River comes with responsibility. Follow these simple suggestions to help keep our beautiful Hudson River clean:

- Stash Your Trash.... Always dispose plastic and garbage onshore
- **Stop the Drops**....Know who much your fuel tank holds and don't top off. Use oil absorbent pads to catch drips while handling the fuel nozzle between the dock and the boat. Fill up your gas tanks while the boat is on the trailer, not in the water.
- Maintain Your Boat.... Regularly scrub you
 decks with fresh water to reduce the need for
 heavy cleaners. Do large cleaning and maintenance while the boat is out of the water. Use a
 hard (not ablative) anti-fouling paint if you plan
 on scrubbing the bottom of your boat while in
 the water

Avoid Scams During Home Improvement Season

Now that it's warm outside – prime time for home repair work – it's important for consumers and contractors to understand and follow Westchester County's contractor licensing laws.

Here are some helpful tips to follow when seeking out a Contractor for home repairs this Summer:

- Before hiring a contractor, review the Westchester Consumer Protection Department's webpage, which offers helpful advice to consumers about hiring a contractor to do work at your home.
- Get written estimates and references from at least 3 contractors.
- Be sure that all work to be done is spelled out in a detailed, written contract including the estimated start and completion dates and the total price, including the costs of labor and materials and any schedule of payments.
- Be wary of unsolicited phone calls and door-todoor sales. Often these are initiated by contractors who are unlicensed and without established business locations.
- Be wary of any "special prices" that are too good to be true or any contractor who just "happens" to be in your neighborhood.

June Recreation Update

Swimming Season at Silver Lake will begin on June 25th, weather and staffing permitting. Swimming at Silver Lake is available to Village Residents and School District Residents. A current Recreation Photo ID is required! Hours are Monday through Friday, 11 AM to 7 PM. Seasonal swim permits are available to purchase for both Village and School District Residents.

Recreation Photo ID Cards: All persons four years and older require a Recreation Park Pass for entrance into Senasqua Park, Mayo's Landing, Black Rock Park & Dog Park, and Silver Lake, or for certain activities such as Pavilion / Facility Rentals and Golf at Hudson National.

Recreation Photo ID Card Fee

Village residents \$9.00 / Village Seniors 62+ FREE School District Residents \$15 / School District Seniors \$10.00 Photo ID cards are valid for 3 years

Two proofs of residency required: driver's license plus a tax bill, bank statement, or utility bill. Recreation Photo ID cards are issued on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 9:00 AM - 3:30 PM in the Recreation Office. Photo ID Card registration & credit card Payment is also available online at crotononhudson-ny.gov/recreation-parks.
