New Police Chief Appointed



The Village Board has permanently appointed John Nikitopoulos as Chief of Police. Chief Nikitopoulos succeeded Chief Russell Harper, who served in his role since 2018, and retired in August of last year.

Chief Nikitopolous, a lifelong Village resident, began his career with the Croton Police Department 35 years ago. As the longest tenured officer on the force, he has witnessed the shifts in direction the department has had over the years. The chief's current goal is to focus on police reform

by molding the department to be "transparent, accountable and community oriented." His hope is that the Croton Police force continues to have the trust of the community it serves. Eventually he hopes for the department to become an accredited agency, a process intended to hold the department to the highest standards in law enforcement. This effort has included various community outreach events, such as August's "Cop with a Cone" event, September's "Child Seat Event" and October's "Fall Festival Police Committee Booth." Another priority for him and the department is to restart the Youth Cadet program, which was suspended due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Part of his tenure has also involved renovating the Police Headquarters, something he has been working closely with the Department of Public Works to accomplish. This has included relocating the detective division to the former historical society offices to comply with the state's "Raise the Age" mandate, and the demolition and reconstruction of the Police Department staircase, improve accessibility to headquarters.

When not at the office, Nikitopoulos spends his leisure time with his family living here in Croton. His hobbies include SCUBA diving, kayaking and working on cars.

Leaf Vacuuming Information & Schedule

The Department of Public Works will begin its leaf vacuuming schedule for Fall of 2021 during the beginning of November! A detailed schedule will be sent out each week on the Village e-news list.

The general schedule is as follows:

- Weeks I & 5: Harmon (south of Cleveland Dr.)
 Weeks 2 & 6: All areas north of Maple Street and west of Old Post Road South.
- Weeks 3 & 7: All areas south of Maple Street and north of Cleveland Drive.
- Weeks 4 & 8: Maple Street and areas north of Maple Street and east of Old Post Road South.

All leaves should be placed loosely at curbside! No twigs, branches, or other yard waste should be mixed in with the loose leaves.

Stormwater 101 from Croton's Department of Public Works

Stormwater runoff is water from rain or melted snow that cannot be absorbed by the soil. As stormwater flows over driveways, lawns and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt and other pollutants. Stormwater can flow into a stormwater system or directly into a lake, stream, river, wetland or costal water. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the water bodies we use for swimming, fishing and drinking.

As stormwater makes it way to the nearest body of water, it can pick up and carry pollutants, such as pesticides, fertilizers, oil and soap, which can harm water when present in sufficient quantities.

Here in Croton, stormwater can often make its way into the Duck Pond, Croton River and Hudson River. Here are some tips to help keep our bodies of water in Croton clean!

- Maintain your cars so they do not leak oil or other fluids.
- Wash your cars on a grassy area if possible so dirt and soap do not flow down the driveway and into the nearest storm drain.
- Do not over fertilize your grass and never apply fertilizers or pesticides before a heavy rain.
- Mulch leaves and grass clippings and place leaves in the yard, not in the street.
- Pick-up after your pet! Dispose of pet waste in the garbage.
